

**SUMMARY**

DAY	EVENTS
June 30	At 1000 hrs. 24 of the 48 100-pound fused bombs returned from a combat mission and placed in revetments for safety, went off with a loud blast which shook the windows in Hqs. A high column of black smoke was seen to rise from the bomb dump; no casualties resulted, however, but one nearby B-17 received major damage from concussion and was marked for salvage.
July 2	Noball Target - 24 A/C forming two Combat Boxes and led by Major Odle, 368th, attacked another buzz-bomb site in the Pas de Calais area through 10/10ths cloud with PFF equipment with unobserved results. No E/A were seen and meager inaccurate A.A. gun fire was encountered.
5	Under the direction of Maj. Dawson the remaining 24 fused 100-pound bombs were detonated at 1350 hrs. A large gallery had collected on and near the Control tower and made a general movement toward the ground when they witnessed the column of black smoke from the prepared position in the bomb dump, immediately followed by a smothered blast. This occasion marked the end of this menace of our A/C could now taxi on this strip of the perimeter and simplify take-off procedure.
6	<p>Today we were honored by Royal visitors, the occasion being the christening of a B-17, "Rose of York", by Her R. H. Princess Elizabeth, also known as Tudor Rose(White) is part of the new official Coat of Arms approved for the Princess. In the Royal party were H.M. King George Sixth, H.M. Queen Elizabeth, Lady Patricia Hambro (nee in Waiting), Sir Eric Miville, Col. The Hon. Bowes Lyon (daughter of the Queen), the Hon. Mrs. Bowes Lyon (Schoolmistress to the Queen), Lt. Gen. James Doolittle and Generals Williams, Travis, Turner, Beeman and Goodrich, Col. Robinson, Col. Reid, W/C Townsend and Capt. Louise Bain. The Royal Party, with Col. Robinson as gracious host, first attended a 40th CEM briefing then, just before they reached the place of christening, a perfect formation of 54 A/C (B-17s) flew over the field. At the christening, which was held in the dispersal area near the briefing and interrogation building, the Princess broke a bottle of cider over the hull turret and the click of movie cameras and official photographers. The crew of "Rose of York", who were lined up in front of the ship, had an opportunity to chat with the Queen and Princess and were entirely won over by the graciousness of their Royal Highnesses. After this impressive and gala ceremony the Royal Party proceeded on a short tour of the Station and were entertained at luncheon in the "A" Mess. This occasion was the first in which the Princess had sponsored a christening and her first trip to American Bomb Stations. Everyone on the Station had an opportunity to see and admire the beauty and grace of Princess Elizabeth and many expressed a hope that they might be invited to one of her tea parties at Buckingham Palace.</p> <p>The 306th Flew 24 A/C as forces "B" and "E" of 12 A/C each of the 40th CEM to bomb Noball targets in France. Force "E", led by Capt. Kealing of the 423rd, bombed with excellent results with no fighter or A.A. gun fire opposition. Force "B" toured their assigned area without finding the target and returned all bombs except 12 booby-traps, which were jettisoned. Moderate flak was encountered by this force but no one was injured. No E/A were seen.</p>

7	LEIPZIG - the 306th put up 34 A/C to form the lead and low Groups, of 18 A/C each, of the 40th CBW. Maj. Salada, 368th, led 30 A/C over the target and bombed the FW 190 factory with good results. No E/A attacked and only moderate inaccurate flak was encountered in the target area.
8	AMIENS, FRANCE - Our target today was a R.R. bridge near Amiens. The 306th put up 25 A/C and we had one abortion. Forces "E" and "F", of 12 A/C each, flew to the briefed target, which was obscured by 10/10 cloud. In search for a T/O the formations got near some flak near Calais and Dunkirk which damaged several of our A/C and slightly wounded Sgt. R.S.O. Neal, official photographer who had been assigned to cover this mission. All bombs were returned and no E/A were seen.
9	Angers area R.R. Bridges - The 306th put up 24 A/C, flying 12 A/C each as lead and low Group of the 40th CBW. Lt.Col. Raper led the Division. The primary was identified but we could not make a bomb run due to cloud cover over the area. The lead Group turned to bomb a R.R. bridge at Le Creusil and directed the low Group to a bridge that was visible at Bauchemaine. Strike photos show both targets of opportunity as receiving direct hits. No E/A were encountered. Meager and inaccurate flak was met at Villers Bocage. P-51s gave close support throughout the mission.
10	Lt.Col. Robert Riordan returned from D.S. and resumed his duties as C.O. of the 369th Bomb Squadron.
11	MUNICH, GERMANY - The 306th put up 37 A/C and 35 A/C bombed the target on PFF technique through 10/10ths cloud. 18 A/C flew as high Group of the 40th "A" CBW and 18 A/C as high Group of the 40th "B" CBW. Both Groups thought bombing was good. Everyone reported that chaff was having a definite effect on the flak defenses, since all bursts were low and none of our A/C were damaged. No E/A were seen and fighter support was good at all times.
12	MUNICH, GERMANY - The 306th flew 17 A/C as lead Group of the 40th CBW and attacked the Bayerische Motorenwerke by instruments through 10/10ths cloud with unobserved results. Fighter support was good and no E/A were seen. A low flak barrage was encountered in the target area, chaff being given credit for upsetting the gunners' aim.
13	MUNICH, GERMANY - The 306th put up 35 A/C forming lead and low Groups of the 40th CBW, headed by Lt.Col. Williams. A PFF run was started, but the Mickey went out during bomb run, and as the center of town was visible the lead bombardier made minor course corrections and set the rate visually. Pictures show bombs in the center of the town between the eastern end of the M-Y and the old town. A.A. gun fire at the target was moderate to intense barrage followed by tracking. Eleven of our A/C sustained severe flak damage and 7 minor damage. No E/A were seen. Fighter support was good after picking up formations about 15 minutes behind schedule.

16	<p><u>MUNICH, GERMANY</u> - Our fourth successive mission on this target, using "through the clouds". The 306th put up 35 A/C forming the lead and low Groups of the 40th CEW, led by Maj. Flannagan; 28 A/C attacked the target. No E/A were seen and support was good. Flak was moderate and mostly low in the target area. <u>Lt. F.G. Jones, 367th</u>, carrying nickels, was last seen just after I.P. during climb. He pulled out to the right, fell back under control and was not seen again.</p>
17	<p><u>ST. QUENTIN/JASSY, FRANCE</u> - The 306th put up 47 A/C to form the complete 40th "B" CEW, led by Lt. Col. Riordan, 369th, and the lead Group of the 40th "D" CEW, led by Maj. Chalfant, 423rd. Weather was solid undercast at enemy coast and CAVU at target. The "B" CEW attacked the R.R. bridge at St. Quentin with good results and the "D" CEW, according to strike photos, show direct hits on a bridge at Jussy. Some meager inaccurate flak was encountered. No E/A were seen and good close support was given over enemy territory.</p>
18	<p><u>PEENEMUNDE</u> - 306th dispatched 36 A/C forming high Groups of the 40th "A" and "B" CEWs and 33 A/C attacked the Primary (Buzz-bomb manufacturing and experimental Plant) visually with good results. No E/A were seen and our fighters gave good support. A.A. gun fire was meager, inaccurate and scattered over target area. Lt. Parks, 423rd, had to feather #1 engine NE of target, then #2 caught on fire; he jettisoned his bombs in the Baltic Sea and headed for Sweden.</p>
19	<p><u>AUGSBURG, GERMANY</u> - The 306th dispatched 11 A/C plus 2 PFF as lead Group of the 40th CEW headed by Maj. Salada, 368th, to bomb the ME factory. The M.P.I. was obscured and a group of buildings on the NE corner of the A/D was bombed with good results. About 15 S/E enemy A/C were seen 4 minutes before I.P. but made no attacks on our formation. Moderate inaccurate, tracking flak was encountered in the target area. Support was generally good.</p> <p><u>Lt. Col. Robert Williams was relieved as C.O. of the 367th Bomb Sq. and appointed Group Operations Officer.</u>  <u>Maj. Charles Flannagan was appointed C.O. of the 367th</u></p>
20	<p><u>KOTHEN, GERMANY</u> - The 306th dispatched 35 A/C, led by Maj. Chalfant of the 423rd, to form the entire 40th "B" CEW. The assigned target was the Junkers Motorenwerke, estimated to produce 40% of the new Jumo 213 engines. Due to the fact that the PFF A/C was hit and knocked out of formation at the I.P. and also because of cloud cover over the Primary each Group bombed targets of opportunity. Getting off course intense accurate flak was encountered over Frankfurt and Leipzig, severely damaging many of our A/C. Lt. McNaught, 423rd, was hit by flak in the Leipzig area, his left Tokio tank and #1 engine catching fire. The A/C dropped out of formation and when last seen disappearing in clouds the fires were out. Lt. Frazee ditched 15 miles SE of Ostend on one engine at 1430 hours and the entire crew were rescued the following day in good health at 1130 hours by two launches of Air-Sea Rescue. No E/A were seen.</p>
21	<p><u>EBELSBACH, GERMANY (Ball-bearing Plant)</u> - The 306th dispatched 35 A/C, led by Major Flannagan, to form the 40th "C" CEW. The route was covered by 8/10ths cloud but the target area was clear. Bombing was visual and believed good but photos do not show incendiary strikes. There was no flak at target or on course and no E/A were seen. Fighter support was excellent throughout.</p>

22	<p><u>BREMEN, HAMBURG, KIEL, GERMANY</u></p> <p>The 306th flew 4 a/c behind 3 PFF in one formation to a control point south of Haligoland. Here the force split with 2 a/c going to Bremen, 2 to Kiel and 3 to Hamburg. The purpose was the delivery of Nickels to these cities, giving the people the true picture of yesterday's attempted overthrow of the Nazi Party by the German Generals. Accurate flak was encountered over Kiel. No enemy aircraft were seen and all of our a/c returned to base.</p>
24	<p><u>ST. IC AREA, FRANCE</u></p> <p>The 306th dispatched 54 a/c to form the 40th "B" 1-2-3 and 4 forces of 12 a/c each and 6 a/c as lead squadron for the 40th "C". Each force was assigned an area 1500 yards south of the forward line of our ground troops. The bombing area was covered by cloud above 13,000 feet except immediately over the target. All forces except "B"1 dropped their 100 pound G.F.s in train with good results. No flak was encountered and no e/a were seen. P-38s and P-51s provided close support. All of our aircraft returned to base.</p> <p>Major Charles G. Duy appointed Station Executive. Captain Paul Baillie appointed Station Adjutant.</p>
25	<p>Lt. Col. Douglas Coleman transferred to A.A.A.F. Redistribution Center #1.</p> <p><u>ST. IC AREA, FRANCE</u></p> <p>Today the 306th sent the same force of 54 a/c to the same area to repeat yesterday's performance of softening up the German lines facing our ground forces. The weather was not as good as briefed but by dropping to 12,000 feet the bombardiers were able to locate their targets and bomb with good results. No E/A or flak were encountered and all a/c returned to base safely.</p>
26	<p>Capt. LaMotta appointed Assistant Station Adjutant.</p>
28	<p><u>LEESBERG, GERMANY</u></p> <p>The 306th dispatched 36 a/c as 40th "A" CBI with Lt. Col. Morgan of the 369th in the lead. Thirty four a/c bombed one of the largest oil refineries of the I.G. Farbenindustrie on PFF equipment through 10/10 cloud with unobserved results. A.A.A. gun fire was low and inaccurate and firing into craft at the target followed by meager accurate tracking on turn off target. Friendly fighter support was excellent all the way and P-51s gave good support in pairs for stragglers. No E/A were seen. All of our a/c returned to base.</p>
31	<p><u>MUNICH, GERMANY</u></p> <p>The 306th dispatched 36 a/c plus 2 PFF as the 40th "A" CBI led by General Turner. Route to target was flown without incident. Just before the I.P. the lead's PFF equipment went out and was turned over to the deputy leader. Thirty four a/c bombed through solid undercast on PFF with unobserved results. No E/A were seen. Meager inaccurate A.A. gun fire was encountered at the target. Close friendly fighter support was provided. All of our a/c returned to base.</p>

The 306th Bombardment Group (H) participated in 19 operational missions during this month. Of these 9 were visual sightings, 2 were PFF and bombs were returned on two occasions. Visual bombing was on a high par, with satisfactory to excellent results obtained on all nine missions where visual sighting was possible. Strategic bombing was on a larger scale than during the previous month, 12 targets being bombed. Five operations were tactical in support of the Western Front ground forces and bombs were returned twice to avoid indiscriminate bombing of occupied territory.

Again the Luftwaffe declined to contest the formations and no encounters were sustained from enemy aircraft. No bombers were lost to E/A and no claims were made. Considering the number of deep penetrations during the month, losses were very low. Four planes are missing, one being reported landing in Sweden, and one ditching in the Channel, with all the crew picked up safely. Two of the missing bombers are attributed to flak and the other two were lost to causes unknown. Friendly fighter support for the month was excellent.

During the month we were honored by a visit of H.M.S. Princess Elizabeth, accompanied by H.M.S. King George VI and H.M.S. Queen Elizabeth and Royal Party. Lt. General James Doolittle acted as escort for this tour of Heavy Bomber Stations. The main purpose of this visit was to christen one of our a/c "Rose of York". The Royal Party talked to the crew members and were taken on an inspection tour of this plane and the Station. Before departing by motor the Party had luncheon at the Officer's Mess with our Commanding Officer, Colonel George L. Robinson acting as gracious Host.

Personnel changes consisted of the promotion of Pfc Jenkins to T/5 and Pvt Greenway to Pfc, and on the 17th 1st Lt. Kenneth L. Kelly )-1111 7 07, C.E. arrived and assumed command in compliance with Paragraph 11, Special Order 196, Headquarters 1st Bomb Division, dated 16 July 1944.

The latter part of the month a plane fire occurred which taxed the department's ability to the limit. A B-17 aircraft caught fire while making a landing, and although the crew managed to escape safely the combined efforts of the platoon and the local National Fire Service for a period of nearly three hours could not prevent the aircraft from being almost completely demolished.

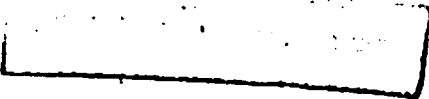
