and also took in many of the smaller targets quite near our camp. All the men in the camp, having been fliers, were especially afraid of bombs falling outside the target area and perhaps landing in our camp. For the most part, classes were not excused during raid but as soon as the bombs began to whistle classrooms were emptied in a very few minutes.

During one particular air raid on a town about two kilometers from our camp, bombs began to fall

did. But on the whole the majority of the men appreciated what the instructors were trying to do and afforded them every possible courtesy.

Rather than delve into the operations of each individual course, I will instead concentrate on my own course in American history. It must be remembered that the problems, pupil interest and attitudes, etc., are not singular to this one course but instead hold true to all the courses. I took the position as
