

306th Group Narrative--- Recall--- Mission 17 February, 1945

~~1. A/C 585-K, pilot Ruegger, brought back five WC-33 and five T-305.~~

36 A/C of 306th Group, flying as 40 "C", made sorties. Assembly was accomplished in spite of ~~intermittent but~~ of intermittent but thick "soup" over England. About 1030 hours, message was received that Plan "B" would be flown, and planes were ordered ~~standing orders~~ to stand by for a half hour. At 1050 hours, 5125-0153E, 1st Division recall was received. Under instructions to jettison bombs, formation proceeded to Point "A", and circled from / until receiving final instructions to drop. 33 A/C jettisoned 594 x 250 H.B. in vicinity of 5229-0251E, at 1231 hours. Two A/C, 359-S, pilot Claeys, and 397-O, pilot Kirby, ~~brought~~ each brought back 18 x 250 G.B. A/C 585-K, pilot Ruegger, brought back five WC-33 and five T-305 nickels. Group returned to base 1413 hours.

Weather: 10/10 low clouds, 800 to 2,000 feet, visibility 1800 yards at takeoff. 5 to 7/10 strato-cumulus, 6 to 8,000 feet, and thin layers of alto-cumulus 12 to 20,000 feet. 8 to 10/10 cirro-stratus 24 to 27,000 feet. Dense persistent contrails above 18,000 feet.
