TO : Commanding Officer, 306th Bombardment Group (H), APO 557

1. Narrative

306th flew 36 a/c including one GH and three PFF, as 40th "B". Route: Selsey Bill 1011 hours; 26 miles NE of Le Havre, 1038; back on course at 4834N-0220E, 1110 hours; pushed gradually south of course and beyond briefed IP to new IP at 4800N-0320E, 1224 hours, by force to left; cut back on course and bombed Stuttgart, 1239 hours; out substantially on course; French coast 5049N-0115E at 1521; 5147N-0104E, 1548; base 1625.

At 1115, Buckeye Red reported briefed route and altitude O.K., but said layer of very dense high stratus might make increased altitude advisable. 1157, Buckeye Blue reported 10/10ths over target, with possible breaks. On way out, Buckeye Blue advised staying at 20,000 feet until control point 4, due to cloud conditions. PFF equipment in 3 a/c O.K., not working in fourth.

2. Fighter Opposition and Fighter Support

No fighter opposition encountered. Fighter support was again excellent.

3. A.A. Gun Fire

Barrage at target was ineffective on this group. Lead had meager accurate tracking visually directed. Group was in chaff trail, when eight bursts broke above lead, next four broke below, then 8 bracketed first two and broke in the midst of the group. Damage: 2 slight, 2 severe, 2 missing (at least one believed in France) all from lead.

4. Bombing

Due to complete cover at IP, lead started bomb run by GH. 45 seconds before bombs away, an oblique hole in clouds revealed target and bombardier completed run visually. Hits were not observed because clouds again screened the ground. Low squadron made a separate PFF run and saw its bombs start on the SW side of the River and walk across the River into the PFF aiming point. High squadron made a 40 second visual run, but due to clouds, hits were not observed. Several crews report hits on both visual and PFF aiming points from previous bombing.

5. Weather

6-8/10ths over continent, tops 21,000 feet with hole over target. Thin high clouds at 26,000 feet in target area. Dense, non-persistent contrails from 22,000 feet up lasted about one and one-half miles.

Ours: A/c 196-0, pilot Frank, hit over target, last heard over friendly territory asking "Messenger" for bearing.

A/c 362-K, pilot Brown, hit over target, left formation under control. Other: Our a/c 512 reported B-17 landing on bomb cratered A/D at about 1415 hours. A/D had two landing strips and was located at approximately 4900N-0400E.

7. Aircraft Returning Early

A/c 515-0, pilot Prokop, turned back at Mount Farn, due to engine failure; brought back 6 x 500 and 4 x 117.

8. Observations

2. Due to complete cloud cover at IP, lead started bomb run by GH. 45 seconds before bombs away, an oblique hole in clouds revealed target and bombardier completed run visually. Low squadron made a separate PFF run and saw its bombs start on the SW side of the River and walk across the River into the PFF aiming point.
