We also take claims for the readjustment allowances authorized in the Servicemen's Readjustment Act (G. I. Bill). Employees in this office have been specifically trained in order to furnish you a personalized service in seeking a job or to advise on the proper agency and methods to use in obtaining other assistance, which you may need and to which you are entitled.

If you have not made satisfactory arrangements for your immediate future, we would be glad to have you call at our office at the above address at your convenience. If you have a job, have entered training, started business for yourself or for any other reason are not available for work, we would appreciate your completing the enclosed card, which requires no postage, and mailing it to us.
